OVERVIEW

Spend a delightful hour on a panoramic tour of St. Barts and come away with an excellent overview of the island, which is an overseas collectivity of France. You will hit many of the architectural high points, including the Eden Rock – a luxurious hotel that has hosted the likes of Greta Garbo and Howard Hughes and the white cross below Fort Gustave that depicts the crucifixion. Still, it is the natural beauty of St. Barts that is most captivating. Although the island is renowned for being wonderfully rugged and hilly, you will see one of the rare flat areas that incoming airplanes barely clear to land on the short runway that ends at the water’s edge. While driving along the circuitous coastal road, you will gaze out over lovely Marigot Beach and pass the village of Lorient, which exudes an air of elegance.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Settle in for a panoramic drive that offers an excellent introduction to St. Barts.
- See the Eden Rock – the island’s oldest hotel.
- Behold the island’s natural beauty while driving along winding coastal roads.
- Pass the seaside village of Lorient on the island’s northern shore.

OVERVIEW

Admire the bountiful marine life and coastal beauty of St. Barts from inside a modern semi-submersible vessel and on deck, where you can enjoy the sea breezes as well. While cruising toward the entrance of Gustavia harbor, you can expect to see green sea turtles gracefully swimming by and the wreck of the Marignan. Now an artificial reef teeming with brightly colored tropical fish, the fishing boat sunk in 1995 during Hurricane Luis. More spectacular underwater sights await you as the semi-submersible heads into St. Barths’ Marine Reserve. Angelfish, sergeant majors, spotted moray eels and tarpon are just a few of the creatures that inhabit the reserve’s protected reefs. On the approach to a group of three rocky islands known as The Saints, the crew will attract even more fish by feeding them. It will be quite the spectacle, especially if sharks join the frenzy.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Cruise in and around Gustavia harbor in a semi-submersible vessel.
- Observe the underwater world through the large viewing windows

down below.

- Take in the gorgeous scenery out on deck, if you prefer.
- Pass over a shipwreck and coral reefs teeming with marine life.
- Watch the feeding frenzy as the crew tosses fish food into the water.

OVERVIEW

OVERVIEW Sail along the western shore of St Barts on a catamaran and then snorkel in the turquoise waters just off shore. All that is required of you is to sit back and relax as the catamaran heads up the leeward coast toward Colombier Bay, which lies within the island’s natural marine reserve. No roads lead to the bay and that relative seclusion ensures a pristine environment for the abundant marine life. Once the catamaran anchors, you will be free to snorkel or stay onboard and just enjoy the natural beauty. Snorkelers may spot brightly colored butterflyfish, schools of grunts and French angelfish, a thin disc-shaped fish that often travels in pairs. Sea turtles tend to congregate in the beds of seagrass and it is quite the thrill to watch one gracefully swim by. The large uninhabited island that you will see a bit farther north is Ile Fourchue.

- Cruise along the beautiful leeward coast of St Barts on a catamaran.

The captain will assess the weather and water conditions for the best spot to anchor, but chances are it will be just outside the harbor to maximize your snorkeling time. The waters there are crystal-clear and teeming with reef fish. You may spot brilliantly colored angelfish, large groupers and schools of queen triggerfish. One of the most curious-looking species is the four-eye butterflyfish, which is named for the two dark spots – or false eyes – on

the sides of its tail, which are meant to confuse predators. You might also see green sea turtles gracefully swimming by and feeding on seagrass and algae on the reef. They are noteworthy as being the largest of all sea turtles and the only ones that are herbivores.
