Then there is Santo Domingo, an imposing fortress that faces yet another part of the sea. While exploring these strongholds, you will hear tales of how Cartagena survived numerous invasions, especially following Sir Francis Drake's devastating raid in 1586.

Highlights along the way include the cathedral and governor's building at the Plaza of Proclamation and stop for a brief visit to the nearby Inquisition Palace, where prisoners were held and tortured until the Spanish Inquisition ended in 1834. The Old City will also afford you an excellent view of San Felipe Castle, the largest Spanish fort in the Americas. It was built in the 17th century to deter pirates from attacking Cartagena for its vast reserves of gold and silver.

- Walk through the oldest section of Cartagena, which was founded in 1533.
- Hear commentary describing the city's history and key landmarks.
- See the infamous Palace of Inquisition, a former headquarters for torture.

OVERVIEW Spend hours browsing the shops within Cartagena's seemingly impregnable walled Old Town, a historical area that UNESCO declared a World Heritage site for its colonial architecture. The venues are particularly intriguing as most of them were originally used for other purposes. As you will discover at Las Bovedas or The Vaults, the low-slung seaside shopping arcade was once a dungeon. Dozens of stores now occupy the former cells along the lengthy arched corridors. Similarly, in a former life, the upscale mall La Serrezuela was part of a Moorish-style bullring. Today, it is an entertainment center full of fashionable shops, especially for jewelry and clothing. Being the largest Spanish-built fort in the New World, Castillo San Cristóbal makes for an ideal historical setting and you may recognize it from the 2011 movie “Pirates of the Caribbean: On Stranger Tides.” El Morro may be an even more iconic fort, which is why parts of the 1997 Steven Spielberg-directed film “Amistad” were shot there. As you walk between these locations and others, the guide will describe their cinematic significance. You will also drop by the neighborhood La Perla, which was featured in the 2011 film “Fast Five,” and the Puerto Rico Cultural Institute, which served as a location for “Black Panther: Wakanada Forever.” You may recognize the Hotel El Convento – a former Carmelite convent built in 1646 – from the TV series “The Flying Nun,” starring Sally Field.

- Gain an understanding of why the locations were chosen for the movies.
