Bird Park contains the world's largest collection of Indonesian birds, and as you wander about you will see birds in their natural habitats and in walk-in aviaries.

Irrigation is the key, and community organizations strictly regulate the distribution of the water to ensure that the rice fields flourish. Lake Beratan is the source of much of the area's water, as you will discover at Ulun Danu, a temple complex on the lake's western shore. It was built in the 17th century to honor the lake goddess Danu and attests to the importance of water in the Balinese countryside. The crystal-clear lake and mountainous backdrop make a striking setting well worth photographing. Other photo stops will be made at traditional Balinese villages on the return drive.

Here, you can observe the local craftsmen as they turn slabs of teak or ebony wood into intricate statues and masks. Upon arrival, you'll be warmly welcomed by a group of Balinese women wearing their exquisite traditional dress who will present you with a flower to wear behind your ear. You'll be escorted to the dining area while refreshing drink given. These include Balinese dance performance and numerous workshop activities where you can learn how to perform a traditional dance, making offering, painting, egg painting. Before departing the Laka Leke Restaurant, you'll be treated to a delicious Indonesian set menu dinner/lunch and dance performance.

OVERVIEW

This fascinating half day excursion provides an excellent opportunity to discover Bali's intriguing world of gods and temples, along with its traditional arts and crafts. Traveling along a scenic route from the pier, you'll first make your way to a popular batik workshop. This lovely Balinese tradition has been passed down for generations and at the workshop you will have an opportunity to admire the distinctive artistry and technique that goes into producing the famous batik cloth. There will be time afforded

here to shop for a souvenir to take home. Re-joining your coach, it's a leisurely drive to your next stop, the magnificent Royal Temple, found in the town of Mengwi which was once the center of a powerful kingdom. A spectacular landmark of historic architecture built in the 17th century, Pura Taman Ayun served as the family temple of the Mengwi dynasty, whose kingdom survived until the late 1800s. This wonderful temple complex includes a wide moat, exquisite wooden shrines and beautifully carved gates, making it one of the area's main attractions. Leaving Mengwi behind, you'll continue on to Bali's most photographed temple, Tanah Lot. Also referred to as the Sunset Temple, the impressive black lava towers of this sacred 16th century temple are dramatically situated on a rocky outcrop that extends 656 feet offshore. Surrounded by pristine aqua waters and the white surf that crashes against the rocks, it's easy to see why this location has become a favorite with photographers.

OVERVIEW

This tour provides an excellent introduction to Bali's essential sights as well as its religion, art and culture. Bali's population is approximately 3.5 million, of which 85% are Hindus and the remaining 15% are either Moslems or Christians. The island's rich art and culture have been traditionally passed down from generation to generation by means of the local community centers and this excursion takes you to several of these key communities where you can see first-hand how Bali's past is infused with the present day. Your tour first travels to at the village of Bona, which specializes in bamboo furniture products. You'll have the opportunity to view the various types of furniture produced here. From Bona, it's on to Kemenuh village, a major woodcarving center. Renowned for its wood-carving, you will be able to watch the local craftsmen as they turn slabs of teak or ebony wood into intricate statues and masks. Of special interest here are the huge carved statues that depict mythical figures, such as the Garuda. Another interesting stop on this tour is at Peliatan village, a village noted for its painters. Traditional Balinese painting was strictly limited to three basic kinds. Most of the paintings were narratives with mythological themes, illustrating stories from Hindu epics and literature. Under the influence of western painters who settled in Bali in the 1930s, Balinese artists began painting single scenes instead of narrative tales, using images from everyday life as their theme. Your visit to Peliatan includes time at one of the local galleries where you can view the beautiful works created by gifted Balinese artists. Continuing on, you'll make your way to Celuk village, a center of gold and silver work where over half the village's population is involved in the silver industry. Original designs in delicate filigree make Balinese jewelry one of the most remarkable styles in Asia. As with most Balinese crafts, gold and silver work is largely a hereditary trade with apprentices beginning to train at a young age and by the time they reach the age of 12, already producing fine ornaments. As your tour draws to a close, you'll make a final stop at Tohpati village, well-known for processing exceptional Batik cloth. Here, you'll have a unique opportunity to observe skilled artisans at work as they use the different methods of applying the colors and printing to the fabric.

- Visit a variety of villages, each known for specializing in a traditional craft.
- Watch artisans produce batik cloth, intricate jewelry and wooden carvings.
- Browse art galleries with paintings that creatively express traditional themes.

OVERVIEW

Gain an understanding of rural life by visiting villages where traditional ways are still strictly followed. In Kesiman, you will drop by a workshop acclaimed for its batik, the ancient technique of dying fabrics to create designs that typically reflect nature, although geometric patterns are also popular. After watching the artisans apply colors and prints to the cloth, you may purchase some batik items. Upon reaching Gulingan, you will see an expanse of verdant rice terraces – which have become synonymous with this part of Bali – and learn how the farmers maintain them. The key is an irrigation system known as Subak that relies on a network of canals, tunnels and weirs to channel the water to the paddies. In the village of Baha, you will see a Balinese house compound that features separate pavilions for different activities. For instance, sleeping is done in one pavilion, cooking in another and praying in yet another.

- Watch artisans create beautiful batik clothing and purchase some, if you wish.
- Learn about the ingenious Subak irrigation system that distributes water throughout Bali.
- View a traditional Balinese house compound with pavilions dedicated to certain activities.

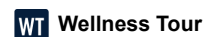
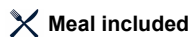
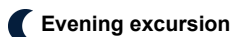
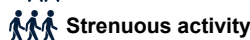
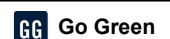
Enjoy a leisurely walk in the countryside while learning about the natural herbs that grow in the wild and then further your understanding in a classroom before enjoying lunch at a local restaurant. A local guide will point out the various herbs and medicinal plants and describe their uses in Bali's traditional culture. You may see plants such as hibiscus and ylang-ylang, whose flowers are crushed together with aloe vera to add fragrance to natural shampoos and cosmetics. Other beneficial plants grow wild along the borders of Bali's expansive rice fields, which are known as sawahs. Depending on where you walk, you may see lemon-scented citronella that repels insects, root vegetables such as cassava and cat's whiskers, an herb that locals use to treat respiratory ailments and high blood pressure. Many of the plants just blend into the landscape, and you would probably never notice them without the guide's help. The class that follows will add nuances to your understanding of these natural plants.

OVERVIEW

Shop for handmade arts and crafts in two village markets renowned for their highly skilled traditional artisans. Wooden products are the specialty of the craftspeople at the Sesela Art Market, and you may see them hand-carving intricate friezes, lacquering boxes and inlaying wooden furniture with decorative shells. The process is slow and that meticulousness shows in the merchandise. Colorful textiles, beaded jewelry and woven rattan goods are also plentiful at the art market. Songket weaving is the signature technique practiced at the Sukarara Craft Village. To create songket fabric, the artisans hand-weave metallic threads together with silk or cotton yarn. As you will discover, the technique is so exacting that it can take a month to make one item. Songket fabrics usually feature traditional motifs and are brightly colored with natural dyes that resist fading. Weaving is so important to the village that nearly every house has its own loom.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Shop for handmade goods ranging from jewelry to wooden crafts at the Sesela Art Market.
- Browse the Sukarara Craft Village for fine apparel made with songket fabric.
- Watch the artisans in Sukarara painstakingly weave the songket fabric on hand looms.

OVERVIEW

Watch grass roof thatch being woven in the village of Sekotong and spend nearly two hours lounging blissfully on Cocotinus Beach. While driving toward the village, you will notice that many of the residences have grass roofs. A tour of the factory that makes the thatching will be enlightening as you will see firsthand how rice straw and bundles of Kunai grass, known locally as alang-alang, are woven into roof panels. At the first locale, you can expect to enter an enclosed vivarium where as many as 15,000 butterflies flit about the garden plants. Waterfalls, ponds and manmade caves enhance the setting's natural beauty and provide a tranquil backdrop. You may also observe rare insect species in an exhibition that explains their unusual characteristics. A fascinating immersion into herbs and spices awaits you at the nearby spice garden, the only such facility in Southeast Asia. As you meander through the 8-acre natural wonderland, you will see exotic spices, aquatic plants and jungle flora that is indigenous to Malaysia. In keeping with the theme of conservation, most of the building materials are recycled or salvaged and repurposed.

OVERVIEW Become immersed in the history of Malacca and how its rulers often changed over the centuries and influenced the city. You will see a replica of one of their oversized trade ships that sank off the coast carrying treasures back to Portugal. The Malacca Sultanate Palace is actually a replica of the structure which was built by the already extinct sultanate of Malacca. The sultanate of Malacca was the ruler of the city before the arrival of the Portuguese in the 1500s. The plan of the palace was based on the Malay Annals' account of Sultan Mansur Shah's palace. Sultan Mansur Shah was the nobleman who ruled Malacca from 1456 to 1477. The Malacca Sultanate Palace is one of its kind in Malaysia as it offers a rare glimpse of the ancient Malay kingdom which once flourished in Malacca. The Dutch colonists followed, as you will learn at Stadthuys, the 17th-century administrative center they built in the center of town. The Queen Victoria Fountain nearby attests to the British rule, which was short but influential. The British social center at the time was the Malacca Club, now the Proclamation of Independence Memorial. The memorial exhibits are fascinating, especially those chronicling Malaysia's fight for independence, which was achieved in 1957.
