At San Felipe Castle, one of the series of fortresses that earned Cartagena recognition as a UNESCO World Heritage site, you will pause for photos before continuing on to view the Palace of Inquisition, where prisoners were tortured until 1834, then continue to the artisan center Las Bovedas. Once a collection of dank dungeons, the arched shopping arcade offers inspired shopping, as it is full of boutiques, art galleries and a handicrafts market.

#### OVERVIEW

Enjoy a leisurely driving tour through Cartagena, taking in landmarks that will provide a wonderful overview of this romantic, walled city. After driving through the affluent Manga neighborhood, you will pause for photos at San Felipe Castle, an impregnable fortress built in the mid-1600s. Evidence of other defensive measures that protected the city from pirates still remains, including thick walls studded with cannons. As you drive along the meandering streets, the guide will point out the wonderful mix of Spanish-style and colonial architecture. There is the lovely Adolfo Mejia Theater, which was built in 1911 to celebrate 100 years of Colombian independence, the landmark clock tower at the former entrance to Cartagena, and the glorious Old City filled with churches, monasteries and palaces. You will also see the more modern side of Cartagena in districts such as Bocagrande and Castillo Grande, where you will pause for photos. This area is known for its exquisite shops and restaurants.

Your culinary immersion will begin with an arepa de huevo – a fried corn cake stuffed with eggs – and carimañolas, which are yuca fritters stuffed with meat or cheese. After an enlightening walk through the walled Old Town, you will stop to dine on Cartagena's most emblematical dish, posta Cartagenera. Made with braised beef, red onions and tomatoes, this comfort food originated with the city's early African and Spanish inhabitants. It is usually served with coconut rice and plantains. Dessert will likely be a coconut confection known as cocada and perhaps a caballito papaya sweet. Free time for shopping follows in Las Bóvedas market.

It offers a wonderfully atmospheric setting to walk or roll, depending on your capabilities. Old Town is full of leafy plazas, including one named for Simon Bolivar, the revered leader that liberated Latin America from Spanish rule. You will also have the chance to explore the colonial San Pedro Claver Church and browse the shops now housed in a collection of former military dungeons.
